



Scotia Scholars^{OM} Awards 2015 - 16 Funded Recipients (PhD Level)

The Scotia Scholars^{OM} Award is a funding opportunity available under our Research Trainee Funding Program. The Scotia Scholarship is intended to provide financial support to high caliber trainees engaged in health research related academic study at Nova Scotia universities. The goal of the Scotia Scholar Award is to support the development of the next generation of highly qualified health researchers and leaders in the Nova Scotia health research enterprise.

This funding opportunity is designed to support individual research trainees as a way to encourage continued interest in careers in health research. Applicants were evaluated based on their past academic, leadership, and research achievements. The award is tenable only at eligible Nova Scotia universities. Each eligible university was allocated a pre-determined number of scholarships.

Funding

The value and duration of the 2015-16 Scotia Scholars^{OM} Award (PhD level) is \$10,000 a year for two years. Year two funds will be released if all requirements are met.
